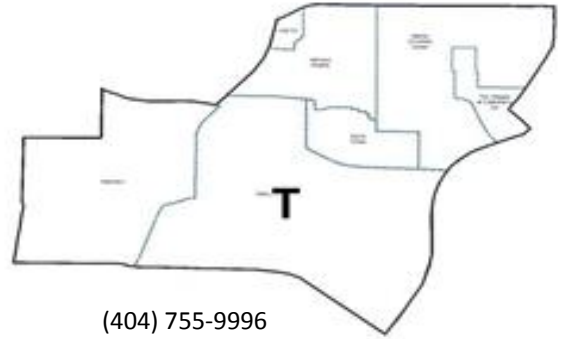

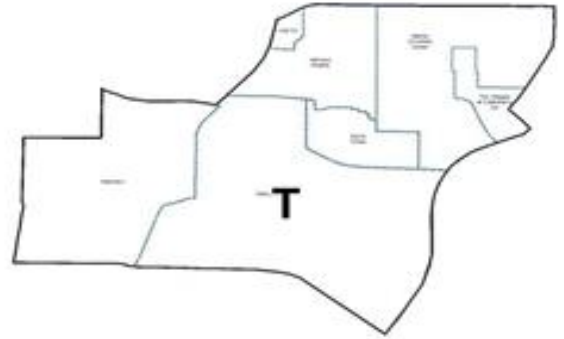

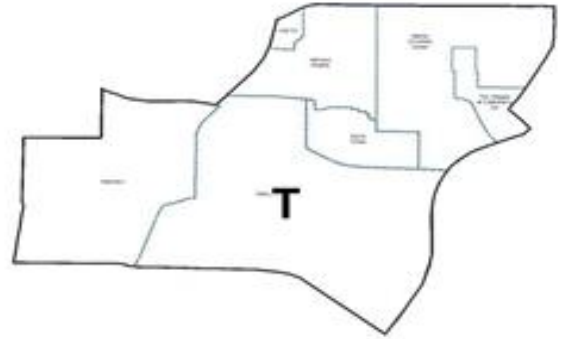

Proposed Change: Change Hosea Feed The Hungry Building Renovation to Acquisition; New Site
<p>Explanation of Change: 2016 CDBG funding of 200,000 was granted to Hosea Feed the Hungry for renovations at its leased community facility located at 1035 Donnelly Avenue SW, Atlanta, Georgia 3010, in NPU-T and Council District 4</p> <p>New investors have purchased the Donnelly Avenue building, and the agency’s lease at this site will not be renewed. The agency has located an alternative warehouse facility for sale, at 2545 Forrest Hills Drive, Atlanta, Ga 30315, in NPU-X, Council District 12. The agency has requested that the use of its existing CDBG grant be re-designated, from renovation of the Donnelly facility to acquisition of the Forrest hills property, which will become the new community service center location for Hosea Feed the Hungry and Homeless, Inc.</p>
City of Atlanta Code of Ordinances (Campaigning by Elected Officials)
<p>As we prepare for 2017 Elections please allow this message to serve as a reminder of the City of Atlanta’s Code of Ordinances. Voting will involve municipal, county and state elections. The Guidelines for campaigning by elected officials at NPU and APAB meetings is strictly prohibited by the City of Atlanta’s Code of Ordinances. Please note the following code section:</p> <p>SEC. 6-3019 Prohibition of Political Forums Part 1, Chapter 6, Article 1, Section 6-1: “It shall be unlawful for any person to use the interior of city hall, its rooms or offices in any type of advertisement of commercial products and political campaigns without first obtaining express permission from the city council. This prohibition shall apply to the filming or photographing of the interior of city hall for use in such advertisements; provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the filming or photographing of the interior of city hall for news coverage purposes by newspapers, magazines and television.”</p> <p>Part 6, Chapter 3, Article B, Section 6-3010: “Neighborhood planning unit meetings shall not be used for political forums or campaigning for city, county, state, or federal elections.”</p> <p>Examples of campaigning could include, but not be limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ☒ Introduction of elected officials as political candidates in upcoming elections; ☒ Passing out campaigning materials and literature; and ☒ Conducting either of the above in city hall, its rooms or offices. <p>If there are any questions or concerns please contact: Ms. Erica Pines at (404)546-0159 or epines@atlantaga.gov .</p>
