As requested by Councilmember Caesar Mitchell regarding the impacts of the closure of Fire Station 7, I am forwarding you the following documents. This packet includes the number of incidents for each City of Atlanta fire station which supports Fire Station 7 territory for the past three calendar years, and the projected number of incidents in the next calendar year without Fire Station 7. The packet also includes maps depicting drive time analysis before and after the closing of Fire Station 7.

While there is no amount of data that can console citizens from the loss of a fire station which has impacted a community for four generations, this information provides a quantitative and qualitative view to assist in the challenging decisions we face.

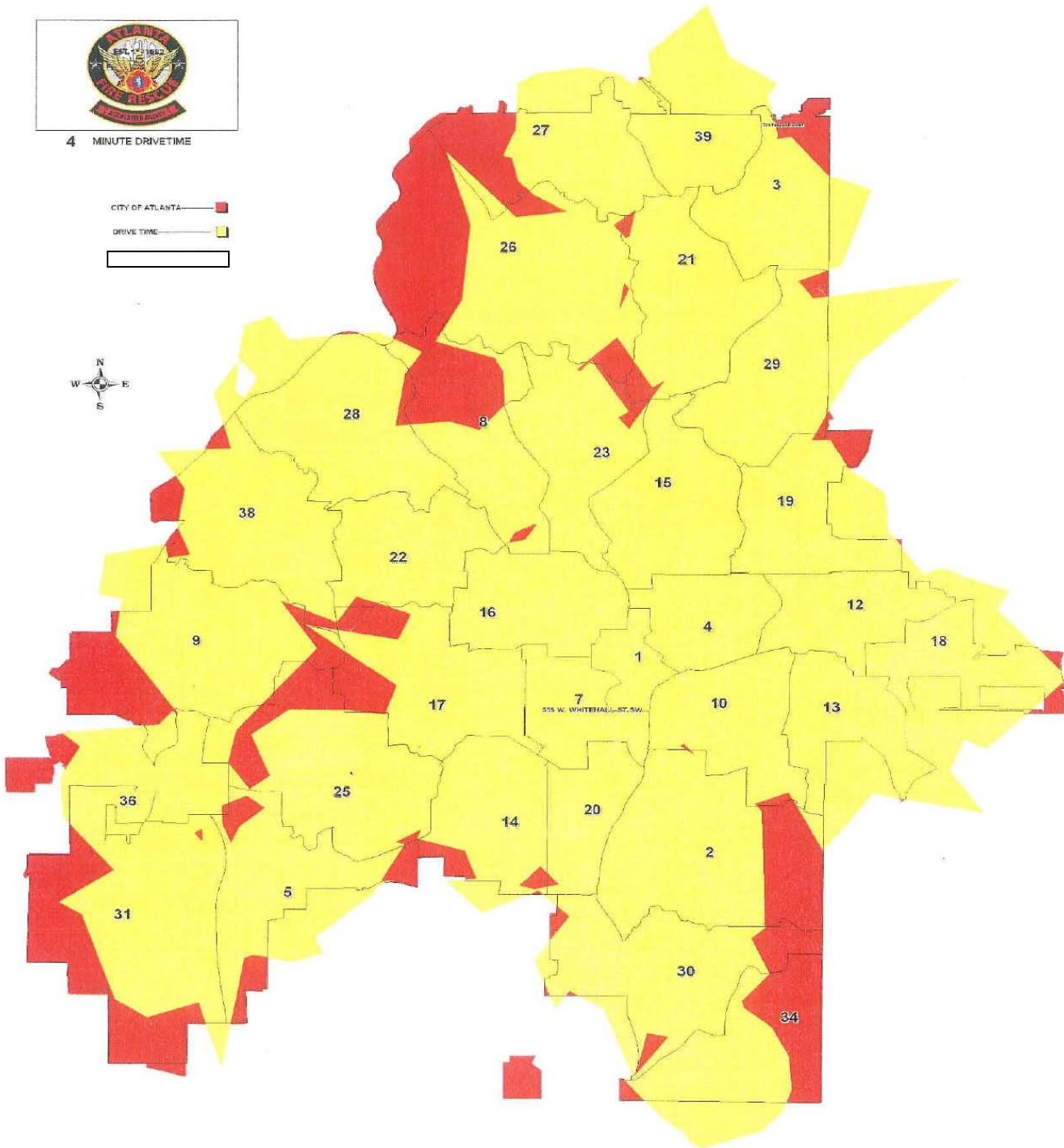
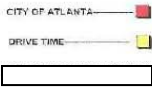

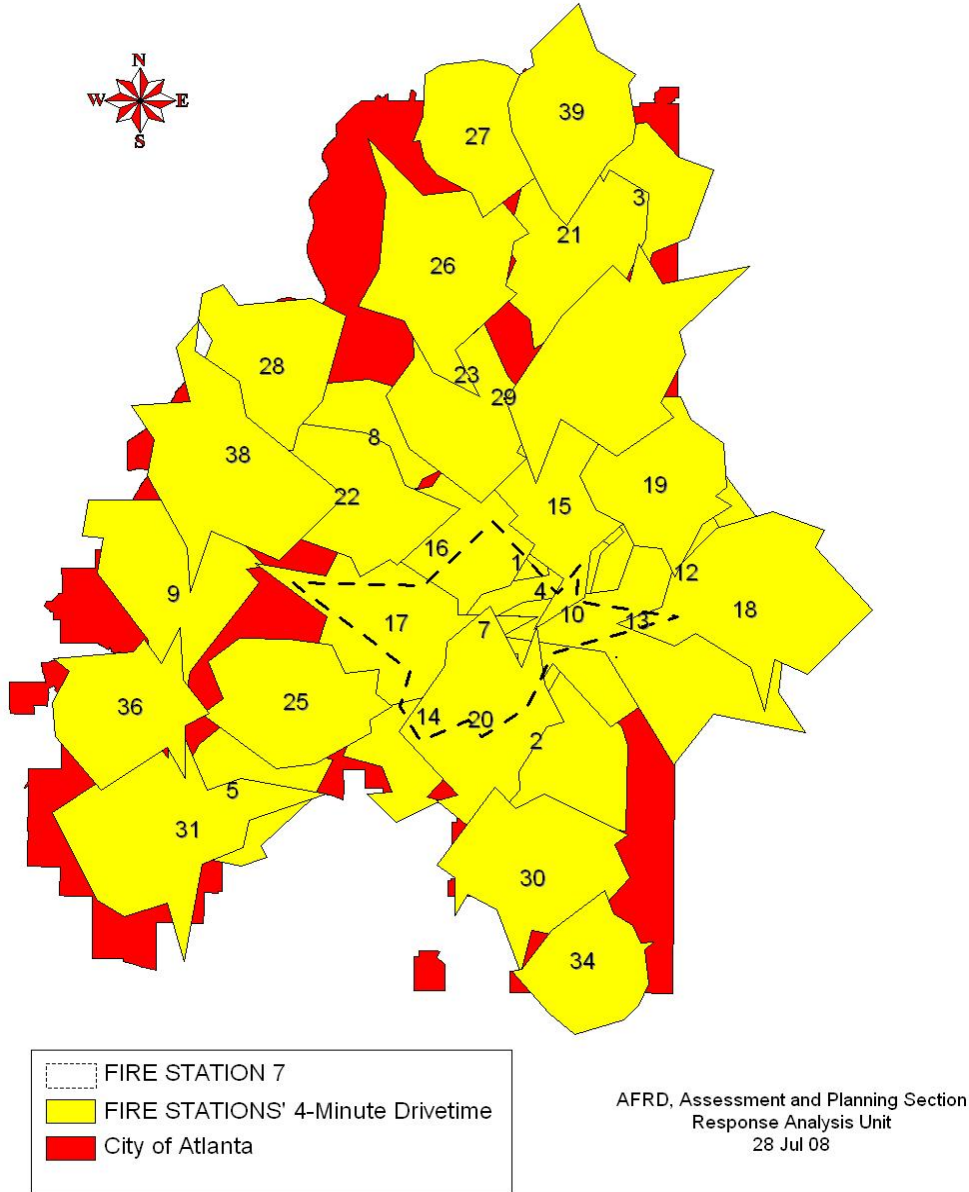


4 MINUTE DRIVETIME



The above diagram is an outline of the city fire stations and territories **WITH** fire station 7. The yellow indicate areas of the city that fire units CAN reach within a four (4) minutes response time. The red indicates areas that CANNOT be reached within the four (4) minutes response time.
